Activities & Achievements

The Beavers, Cubs & Scouts took part in various indoor & outdoor camps throughout the year to Auchengillan Camp site, Fordell Firs, Sealife at Loch Lomond and the Hobbit Houses at Lapwing Lodge. There was also a summer trip to Croatia for the Cubs and Scouts. At these camps the Beavers, Cubs and Scouts learn Scouting skills which form, part of their program (cooking, camping, first aid, hiking etc.) Badge work was also part of the evening programs carried out within the Scout Hall. There were also visits to Ten Pin Bowling, Kayaking, Trampolining, Fencing, Fishing, Wakeboarding and Mugdock Country Park. There were a number of fundraising nights including a race night and a coffee morning. The Leaders also had to participate in various training as part of their Scout Warrants. The GDPR module was completed by all trustees. During the year significant spend on repairs to the building were undertaken. It is forecast that for the next few years similar sums will require to be spent to maintain the building.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees believe that around 12 months of annual expenditure is an appropriate level of reserves in order to cover the timing differences between receipts and payments and to allow for any unexpected items of expenditure on items of expenditure such as training, premises repairs and renewals.
