Activities & Achievements

The Beavers, Cubs & Scouts took part in various indoor & outdoor camps throughout the year including to Auchengillan Camp site. At these camps the Beavers, Cubs and Scouts learn Scouting skills which form, part of their program (cooking, camping, first aid, hiking etc.) Badge work was also part of the evening programs carned out within the Scout Hall and at home. There were also visits to the Panto, Badgetastic, the Sealife Centre, MotoX and Trampolining. There were 2 Beaver Bingo nights to raise funds for the sections. On 16 March 2020 the Scout Hall was closed due to the Covid-19 virus and has remainded closed for the remainder of the year Some virtual sessions were run so that the sections could continue at home. Subscriptions continue to be paid. A grant was obtained for sports equipment for the hall, another to open a new Cubs section and and a further grant from East Dunbartonshire Council for business support in relation to Covid-19. During the year there was some repairs to the building were undertaken, mainly to the hall ceiling. It is forecast that for the next few years some significant sums will require to be spent to maintain the building, mainly on heating and the roof with which there are ongoing issues.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees believe that around 12 months of annual expenditure is an appropriate level of reserves in order to cover the timing differences between receipts and payments and to allow for any unexpected items of expenditure on items of expenditure such as training, premises repairs and renewals.
